TIMISOARA – DID YOU KNOW, ...

If until now we wanted to arouse your curiosity about this year's ENRLMM conference host city, this time we thought to do the same with the region/country in which Timisoara is located.

Thus, we want to reveal to you some beautiful places located relatively close to Timisoara, which you might be interested in if you want to take advantage of this travel opportunity to get to know our beautiful region/country or, why not, you could use this information on another occasion

For those who travel by plane, it's possible to rent a car directly from the Airport. For example, a VW Golf/Passat provided by [AVIS](#) is about 70 € by day (depends on the moment of rental).

You could visit the beautiful cities Alba Iulia and Sibiu. From Timisoara to Alba Iulia are about 220 km and from Timisoara to Sibiu are 260 km (about 3 hours to drive). Both cities are in the same direction, so you can travel in the morning from Timisoara, with a stop in Alba Iulia and then to Sibiu. There is a highway from Timisoara to Sibiu, but it's not recommended to be a one-day trip.

Another option is to visit the Danube area, there are wonderful places, but is no highway and the travel lasts about 3-4 hours (Timisoara-Lugoj-Caransebes-Herculane-Orsova-Dubova and back). Or to reach the same destination point but from Timisoara to Resita-Anina-Bozovici-Herculane-Orsova. Of course, you can also spend one night in Baile Herculane (this is an old/ancient resort dated from Romans times - but at the moment is not in very good condition). However, the hotels are quite good (and cheap - about 60-80 €). And the location is well-known for its very clean air.

Alternatively, you can travel around Timisoara (Timis/Arad/Caras county), if you'd like to visit the rural area.
