GOOD TO KNOW ABOUT - ... LUGANO

Walking along the lakeside promenade in Lugano, you will discover one of the city most picturesque spots: Parco Ciani. This beloved park serves as a popular gathering place for both tourists and locals. Here, you can enjoy Lugano's sunny days, stroll around with friends or take



an outdoor lunch break with your colleagues, all within a five minutes walk from the city center.

The park represents a prominent green space within the city, characterized by its diverse vegetation that seamlessly integrates two distinct landscape styles. On one side of the park, you will find a mix of English and Italian styles, with carefully tended flower beds and big open lawns. But heading over to the other side by the Cassarate River, there is a whole different vibe – wilder and more natural, with local plants growing freely in a rugged setting. This juxtaposition of styles provides visitors with a distinctive and varied experience within the park area.

Parco Ciani also houses several notable buildings, including Villa Ciani, the Convention Centre "Palazzo dei Congressi," the dock, the Cantonal Natural History Museum, and the Cantonal library.
